SHIFA CARDIOLOGY TEAM PIONEERING THE USE OF LATEST ROTAPRO TECHNOLOGY IN REGION PROMISING ENHANCED PATIENT CARE



Otablation Angioplasty is a minimally invasive procedure to treat blocked arteries without the use of a major surgical incision. This technique allows patients to recover early with less hospital stay and has lesser chances of infections. It is specifically used in patients with severely calcified heart arteries deemed unsuitable for routine stenting. Under the supervision of Dr. Asaad Akbar Khan, Consultant Cardiologist, the Cardiology team of Shifa International Hospital has performed the highest number of Rotablation cases in Pakistan by any healthcare facility since 2019. Cardiology team of Shifa International Hospital comprises of dedicated and highly qualified heart specialists offering solutions ranging from common to complex with an emphasis on patient care, trust, and ethical practices. Dr. Asaad has trained many physicians in the United States and is now a proctor/lead trainer of Pakistani doctors for structural heart interventions and complex coronary interventions including rotablation-assisted angioplasties. He is also serving as an international proctor for Medtronic and Boston Scientific for the entire Middle East & North African region (MENA).

SEMINAR NAMED "SYNDROMIC TESTING: THE UNRAVELLING ROUTE TO RAPID DIAGNOSIS"

The event provided an overview of Syndromic testing, focusing on its applications in diagnosing sepsis, meningitis, and pneumonia. Speakers emphasized the positive impact of rapid diagnosis on patient care and discussed challenges and solutions for implementing syndromic testing in healthcare settings. Participants included medical professionals from various departments of Shifa, engaging in an interactive Q & A session facilitated by SCOPE, the educational division of Shifa Foundation.

What is a Heatwave?

Heatwave is a period of unusually high temperatures, higher than the norm for a region.

What are Heat-related illness symptoms?

Symptoms include heavy sweating, dizziness, headache, nausea, muscle cramps, and fainting.

Who is most at risk?

The elderly, children, chronically ill, outdoor workers, and those without air conditioning.

How can Heatwaves affect health?

They can cause dehydration, heat exhaustion, heatstroke, and worsen existing health conditions.

What to do if someone has heat exhaustion or Heatstroke?

Move them to a cool place, hydrate, cool their body, and seek medical help if severe.

How to prevent Heat-related illnesses?

Stay hydrated, avoid peak heat, wear light clothing, and use cooling methods like fans and showers.

How to stay informed about Heatwaves?

Follow weather forecasts and heat advisories via apps, news, and local health updates.

Can Heatwaves have long-term effects?

Yes, repeated exposure can lead to long-term heart, lung, and kidney issues.

How can communities help during Heatwaves?

Set up cooling centers, distribute water, provide health info, and check on vulnerable people.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE DEPARTMENT OF SHIFA INTERNATIONAL HOSPITAL & SCOPE IN COLLABORATION WITH WHO ORGANIZED THE NATIONAL WORKSHOP

his two-day workshop aimed to equip healthcare workers with the knowledge & skills necessary for effective Healthcare Associated Infections (HAIs) surveillance & Infection Prevention & Control (IPC) risk assessment. On day one, Dr. Mahrukh Durrani, Assoc. Director Medical Education\ Medical Staff Affairs (MSA) welcomed the attendees and highlighted the background of Shifa Centre of Professional Excellence (SCOPE) that was providing administrative support to the event. Dr. Farah Sabih, National Professional Officer (NPO) International Health Regulations (IHR), World Health Organization WHO took the stage reiterating the objectives of the workshop and the importance of active participation in the sessions to maximize learning. Ms. Arifa Khatoon, Sr. Manager, Infection Control Department at Shifa International Hospital started off by providing a comprehensive overview of (HAIs), defining (HAIs) and categorizing them into various types. Ms. Shabnam Bilal, Manager IPC, Indus Hospital and Health Network, Karachi, spoke on the criteria for surveilling common (HAIs), explaining how to identify, document, and report infections accurately. Prof. Dr. Shagufta Hussain, former HOD Microbiology, PIMS Hospital Islamabad introduced the WHO (HAIs) Software App, explaining its features & benefits for (HAIs) surveillance. On day two, Dr. Abdul Wahab Hassan, Director Projects, Shifa International Hospital explained the critical role of Infection Control Risk Assessment (ICRA) in healthcare settings. Ms. Komal Fizza, Assistant Director Quality, Shifa International Hospital discussed the importance of assessing risks related to patient care, treatment procedures, and the healthcare environment. Dr. Ejaz Ahmed Khan, Consultant Infectious Diseases and Paediatrician Shifa International Hospital highlighted the importance of ICRA during construction projects within healthcare facilities to prevent infection risks. Dr. Maimoona Siddiqui delivered closing remarks and deliberated over the critical importance of (HAIs) surveillance and (IPC).





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
